### GLUE

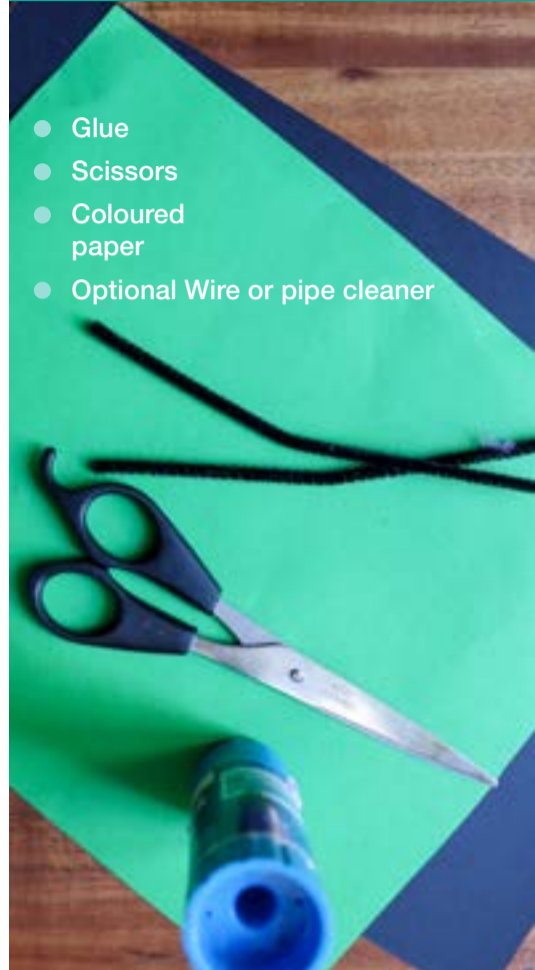


### ADD STAND



## WHAT YOU NEED

- Glue
- Scissors
- Coloured paper
- Optional Wire or pipe cleaner



## ARTMAKING



- 1 Fold your paper in a concertina (like a fan).
- 2 Cut shapes out of the paper, making sure you leave joining sections like when you make a paper doll chain.
- 3 Join and glue the first and last tab together to create a cylindrical form.
- 4 You can make a stand for your sculpture using a pipe cleaner or another folded paper shape.
